AN ENTREPRENEURIAL MINDSET IS ESSENTIAL TO STARTING AND GROWING A SUCCESSFUL SMALL BUSINESS.

Small businesses have become the engines that are now driving our economy with new businesses accounting for nearly all net new job creation. Yet the concept of entrepreneurship is not well understood and many lack the necessary mindset and the skills that will enable them to succeed.

The Ice House Entrepreneurship Program (Small Business Edition) is designed to inspire and engage participants in the fundamental aspects of entrepreneurial thinking while immersing them in the process that will enable them to develop entrepreneurial skills.

Course Description

The Ice House Entrepreneurship Program (Small Business Edition) is an experiential, problem-based learning program designed to expose participants to the fundamental aspects of an entrepreneurial mindset and the limitless opportunities it can provide.

Inspired by the life-story of Pulitzer nominee Clifton Taulbert in the companion text, Who Owns the Ice House? Eight Life Lessons from an Unlikely Entrepreneur, the program combines more than ten years of research with the firsthand experience drawn from a wide variety of successful "unlikely" entrepreneurs. Drawing on eight fundamental concepts, the course exposes participants to the underlying thought and process that enables entrepreneurs with limited resources to identify, evaluate, and transform new ideas into successful endeavors.

Each lesson contains video case studies featuring a variety of "unlikely" entrepreneurs who share their knowledge and experience, thus reinforcing the practical application of the core concepts. Participants are then immersed in real-world entrepreneurial experiences that enable them to develop and hone entrepreneurial attitudes and skills.

CORE CONCEPTS

Lesson 1: Power of Choice

The ability to choose is fundamental to an entrepreneurial mindset, empowering participants to create the life they imagine.

Lesson 2: Recognizing Opportunity

An entrepreneurial mindset sees problems as potential opportunities, recognizing that solving problems for others is the key to small business success.

Lesson 3: Ideas into Action

An entrepreneurial mindset is action oriented, testing ideas in the real-world before making large scale investments of time, effort, and money.

Lesson 4: Pursuit of Knowledge

An entrepreneurial mindset ignites curiosity and encourages the self-directed pursuit of knowledge through formal and informal methods.

Lesson 5: Creating Wealth

An entrepreneurial mindset is resourceful, leveraging limited resources to achieve goals.

Lesson 6: Building your Brand

An entrepreneurial mindset builds a brand of reliability where actions speak louder than words and following through on simple solutions leads to unforeseen opportunities.

Lesson 7: Creating Community

An entrepreneurial mindset understands the power of creating an intentional network of experienced entrepreneurs who can provide critical guidance and support.

Lesson 8: The Power of Persistence

Perseverance and determination are vital to an entrepreneurial mindset, enabling ordinary people to face challenges and overcome setbacks on the road to success.

PRACTICAL APPLICATION

The Ice House Opportunity Discovery Process: The Ice House Opportunity Discovery Process enables aspiring entrepreneurs to "bootstrap" their way into a successful business rather than undertaking significant financial risk. Drawing from best practices of design thinking, participants learn to identify problems, find solutions, and make customer connections through an iterative experimental process. To engage in the process, participants use the Ice House Opportunity Discovery Canvas – a simple tool that guides them through the process of interaction and observation, experimentation and adaptation.

The Entrepreneurial Learning Process

Ice House uses problem-based, experiential learning through the Opportunity Discovery Process, which accurately reflects the learning process entrepreneurs intuitively undertake. Working in peer groups, participants identify a problem to be solved, determine what they already know, what they need to know, and how and where to access new information that may lead to the resolution of the problem. Participants apply their ideas in the real world by working through their solutions to problems with local entrepreneurs, who can provide guidance and support as well as help their ideas evolve. Participants then share experiences, conduct presentations, and hear guest lectures. Through the process, they become self-directed in seeking solutions.

Facilitator Training & Support

Facilitator Role

Ice House facilitators do not need to be subject matter experts in the field of entrepreneurship. The role of the instructor is to facilitate learning by supporting, guiding, and monitoring the learning process. Rather than providing specific directives, the instructor encourages participants to identify and solve problems, apply new knowledge, take action, and cope with challenges and ambiguity. After all, entrepreneurship is a search process of discovery that requires participants to take ownership of their ideas as well as their ability to think, learn, and grow.
